She is also principal of the reference school "Abgucken erwünscht" with a focus on teaching and learning in a team. Reference schools are that have undergone a sustainable development process with a particular focus on school

development. They offer training courses and can be visited. The focus of the school work is individualized, project-oriented learning. It is about being able to learn future-oriented with a high degree of self-responsibility and with the support of digitally networked and digitally oriented learning scenarios and practical applications. The Media School of the State of Saxony-Anhalt has network experience in a variety of fields, currently especially in the field of media education. The school is committed to building sustainable structures to support schools in creating and developing "education in the digital world" concepts. A central instrument for school development is the nationwide and international exchange of experience.

As principal, he has been involved in the use of digital media since the 1990s. As a skeptic and advocate in one person, he advocates a balanced use of analogue and digital possibilities in the classroom and the effective support of administrative processes through digitization.

Silke Heick is 48, married and has two daughters (22 years old, 17 years old) My work: I work in a school for students who have learning disabilities. 152 pupils, 29 teachers and 3 teacher's assistants attend our school. We educate pupils grade 1 through grade 10 in different subjects. Our school is a



special contact for a large area, where we support teachers and parents with counselling and further trainings. We support our students with special methods to decrease their problems with learning. Another part of our work is teaching students of any grades who are in hospital because of a long lasting psychological illness. Furthermore we conduct consulting and diagnostics for students in schools who have behavioural problems in class and thus can not or only hardly follow normal lessons. Our most current goal is the implementation of digital media into our school-everyday-life. In my opinion it is necessary for students to gain knowledge about this topic for their future work after school. Unfortunaltely our school is not equipped with the technical equipment to reach our goal. That is why we lead many discussions with the provider for school equipment. So we have to be creative in our methods to become more accessible when it comes to modern media. Our eager team works on projects like the robot "Thymio", the online platform "moodle" and the operating system "PUAVO". Our aim: As many pupils as possible should get a school-leaving qualification and then complete an apprenticeship.

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Ueli Nick

Ueli Nick is principal of the elementary school Bubendorf in Hersberg, Canton of Basel-Land, Switzerland. He successfully implemented Puavo at his school. He uses with the entire college the method of formative self-evaluation Luuise for school development. Our Visit to the elementary school in Bubendorf in January 2018 was very exciting.
